

**Public Notice/ Letter**  
**October 2008**

This is a public notice, letter to those persons concerned, having to do business with that of the Great Council of Chiefs and that of the Tejas Tribal Courts at Law. The Tribal Courts at Law is not a respecter of persons. Governments and or that of any titles and or businesses it is a Court where justice and fair practice of law is applied. Thus any person as to their title and or rank having question about any people's claim of Native Heritage, Ancestry, thus Tribal affiliation may file a suit in tribal court for eligibility and determination of such status.

This is a set industry standard which has been accepted and upheld by the US Federal System and determined and accepted by the US Congress as a set standard. By such law and ruling only an Indian Nation, thus their courts and or by their own system, and procedures can determine eligibility and enrolment of an individual.

In this Nation our procedure is a due course of the legal system, a set industry standard. As such protections can be done under USC 25- CH 21 ICWA for minor children and that of the disabled and elderly through Tribal code.

This paragraph is concerning Wichita County and that in respect to their Judges and that of the Administration. Those responsible have been given proper correspondence as to the procedures that they do need to follow. No one is privileged, and as such we the Tribal Nation have attempted to develop a MOU and MOA concerning these matters before such happened. Now as to that they have occurred and there is no IGA in place, and the County is being adversarial to such actions in to the disregard of the State Treaty of 1844, and not extending such good faith and credit. Thus, none shall be offered, extended, or given.

Thus the county is in arrears in its payments to the Tribal Nation by that of over 100 years, and is already in violation of said treaty. Thus you will need to file a suit in the manner instructed as pertaining to persons in question.

The Tribal Courts will be able to assist you in your concern; however you will need to pay for such services of which you have given such an order for.
